Shennong Street: A Glimpse into Tainan's Past

Step onto **Shennong Street**, Tainan's best-preserved old street with over 300 years of history. Once the bustling heart of the "Five Canals" area during the Qing Dynasty, many of its houses still retain their original Qing Dynasty and early Japanese colonial-era appearance. Historic sites like **Jinhua Temple**, the Taiwan Inaugural Yaowang Temple, and Yongchuan Grand Palanquins have revitalized Shennong Street, making it a must-visit photo spot in Tainan.

Ancient Temples and Imperial Gates

Just a short walk away is **Jinhua Temple**, a city-designated historic site since 2005. This unique temple, primarily dedicated to Guan Di and the Three Kings (Ma, Li, and Huang), is one of the few in Tainan named "Fu" (府), signifying its status as a royal temple.



Next, we'll visit **Fashen Temple**, the only existing temple in Taiwan dedicated to the God of Wind. As one of the "Seven Temples and Eight Shrines of Tainan Prefecture," it's a significant cultural landmark. Right in front of the temple stands the **Jieguanting Stone Archway**, a city-designated historic monument built in 1777 by Taiwan Prefect Jiang Yuan-shu during the renovation of Fashen Temple, serving as an imperial reception pavilion.



Art, Faith, and Local Flavors

Our journey continues to **Xiluo Temple**, also known as Fengshan Temple or Shengwangong Guan. Located near Fashen Temple and Jieguanting, it's a central hub for the Guangze Zunwang faith in Taiwan.



Experience Tainan's unique artistic side on **Haian Road**, an open-air "street museum." Since 2004, art installations have transformed this old district, making it a vibrant symbol of Tainan's culture and creativity. The latest exhibition, "Haian Street Museum – The Story of the City Begins Here," features 13 new artworks, extending to the Daliang Ecological Park by the canal.

Timeless Markets and Historical Footprints

Immerse yourself in a nostalgic journey at the **West Market (Asakusa Youth New World)** on Zhengxing Street, affectionately known as "Big Vegetable Market." This area feels like stepping back into the 1980s. Explore the Asakusa and container markets outside, home to many famous eateries. Then, venture into the alleys towards Yongle Market, where you can hear old stories, admire ancient architecture, and discover hidden historical gems.



Finally, we'll visit **Kansijie Church**. Kansijie (Looking West Street) was a crucial thoroughfare in the Five Canals area, named for its westward orientation towards the harbor. This street beckoned Dr. James Laidlaw Maxwell, a Western missionary doctor, who pioneered Christianity and Western medicine in Tainan. As such, Kansijie serves as a profound symbol commemorating his contributions to the city.



Our tour concludes at **Shueixian Temple**, officially known as Taijun Sanjiao Shueixian Temple, a city-designated historic site and another of the "Seven Temples and Eight Shrines of Tainan Prefecture."
